Iron City Blues A Scott Jackson Film

In southern Tennessee, near the Alabama border, is Iron City. Settled in the early 1800s, it was at one time Tennessee's wealthiest city with a rich concentration of iron ore fueling industrial revolution growth. But the iron mines left during the Great Depression and the population dwindled to less than 500 people. The DVD is a documentary about the town and its years of fire, decay, and lawlessness.


The principle "investigator" is Big Mike Griffin. Standing 6'10", he is an imposing guitar player and motorcyclist who decides to visit the town and talk to the locals about their experiences. Though warned that anarchy prevails, Griffin and a pal ride into town, after which he is inspired to write and record a song "Iron City Blues," which is later debuted in front of a rowdy crowd. It's a compelling film, and very much a visit to a part of the world that few of us ever see.

To his credit, Griffin relates easily to the Iron City locals, and the music he creates, while somewhat derivative, is still catchy and performed with particular panache during the live concert.

The film has already been recognized at a number of festivals and this DVD includes a bonus CD of 19 Griffin originals that mix blues and Southern rock with Tele twang and the stomp of some mighty big boots. – **ECS**
